Race Day Information

Dear Runner,

The 7th annual **Run Falmouth** is just around the corner, so here's everything that you'll need to know for race day. We hope you're looking forward to Run Falmouth, the 4th race in the 2019 Cornwall Glass and Glazing Grand Prix as much as we are.

Essential Race Information:

Registration Opens: 8.00am – 9.30am

Please adhere to this without exception as there is a walk to the start line

Race Start Time: 10.00am

Race HQ: The Falmouth Hotel, Castle Beach, Falmouth, TR11 4NZ

Start: End of Castle Close, just off Castle Drive

Finish: Cliff Road outside the Falmouth Hotel

Registration: This will take place in the Ballroom at the Falmouth Hotel.

Please enter via the external door and not through the hotel main entrance.

Please ask staff outside (all wearing Hi-Vis) for details, **not** the hotel reception.

Toilets: Portaloos outside the Falmouth Hotel on Cliff Road. Public toilets at Gyllyngvase and Castle beach. There are **no** showers or toilets available for use in the hotel.

Directions: Click [here](#) to open google maps for directions to the Falmouth Hotel.

At the T-junction at the end of Penance Road turn left. The Gyllyngvase car park is on your right, opposite St Michaels Hotel, and the Falmouth Hotel is approx. 300m along the beach front on your left. There will be road closures in place along Cliff Road, Castle Drive and Pendennis Rise from 9.00am until approx. 1.30pm.

Parking: There is **no** parking available on the day at the Falmouth Hotel. Parking is at Gyllyngvase car park (free) with other car parks available in town. For further parking info please click [here](#).

Number Collection: All **UK Athletics Affiliated** Club Runners will have their numbers grouped into their respective Clubs for a member to collect. Clubs will then be free to disperse their team numbers between themselves. All numbers will be named. All runners **un**affiliated and those who do **not** have a UK Athletics Affiliated number, will need to go to the registration desks, organised by last-name, and collect their number individually. Space at the Falmouth Hotel is at a premium, and so thank you for your support of our decision to ease congestion.

You must **fill out the reverse of your race number** with Emergency Contact/Medical Info.

At registration you can also hand in any sponsor money that you have collected, (cash or cheques payable to Cornwall Hospice Care). If you have collected sponsorship pledges but still have money to collect, please photocopy your form and hand in the original on the day.

We ask that **all runners move away from the registration desks** to complete their medical information on their numbers.

Pens and safety pins will be on the tables in the ballroom.

Baggage: A bag drop facility will be provided and will be located outside the side entrance of the Ballroom in a Cornwall Hospice Care van.

You will find a tear-off strip on your race number that can be attached to your bag. When the race begins this van will be locked and only reopened at the end of the race. As a member of staff will not remain on the van we would ask you **not** to leave anything valuable in your baggage. Cornwall Hospice Care, Falmouth Road Runners or The Falmouth Hotel will not be held liable for loss or damage to any personal possessions left in the bag drop area.

Headphones: MP3 players, earphones and headsets are banned from GP races, anyone reported wearing them will be disqualified.

Marshals: The route marshals must be obeyed at all times; they are volunteering their time and **are there for your safety**. Volunteer marshals cannot stop traffic, and therefore may need to stop you crossing a road if it is unsafe to do so. Any runners not following the instruction of a marshal will be disqualified.

There will be a route marshal on a bike leading the route, and a sweep vehicle following the runners. If at any point you feel that you need assistance, medical or other, then please ask one of the route marshals to make contact with the race headquarters.

If you feel that you need to pull out from the race, please do not just leave the course. You **MUST** inform a marshal and if possible return to the finish to report that you are safe.

First Aid: Medical support will be provided on the day with a paramedic following the route. Please ask a marshal if you feel that you need their services when out on the route.

Race Route:



The route takes in some of the most scenic parts of Falmouth along the coast and inland, but there are some areas where the roads narrow and we urge you to take extra care on these sections. Roads will only be closed at the start/finish of Run Falmouth, thereafter you'll be running on the road with traffic passing.

Please run strictly **on the left** side of the road, **at all times** - unless you've been directed otherwise by a marshal. Although there will be plenty of warning signs to motorists around the route, we would ask you to take care and be aware of passing traffic. **It is advisable to wear bright coloured clothing.**

Cut off time: There is a course completion time limit of 3hrs 15minutes (by 1.15pm). If you haven't completed by this time or don't think you will, you may of course continue but be aware that many of the route marshals will have stood down from their posts by then. There will still be a sweep vehicle/marshal, but you will need to use the pavements etc., as you would as a pedestrian. In addition, you won't be given an official completion time.

Water Stations: There will be four water stations on the route at approx. mile 4, 7, and 9 and 11.

Finishing: As you finish the race, please **ensure your running number is clearly visible on the front** of your vest so that the time keepers can record you correctly, and ensure you stay in the finish funnel after you've crossed the line in the correct order.

On completion of Run Falmouth we would like to congratulate you by presenting you with a Run Falmouth 2019 medal – and there will be bananas and water. These will be distributed on the lawn outside the hotel after the finish line. There will also be the opportunity to purchase Bacon Baps (£4.00) and Tea/Coffee (£1.75) in the Ballroom after the race.

Results: Results for the race will be available to see on the Cornwall Hospice Care website and on the Falmouth Road Runners site.

Prize Categories: The prize categories are as below. If you would like to join us and attend the prize presentation, this will take place in the Pendennis Ballroom at 1pm.

Men: First 3 overall. Then first 3 U35.

Teams: First 3 (6 runners to count), with prizes for each team member.

Ladies: First 3 overall. First 3 U35.

Teams: First 3 (6 runners to count), with prizes for each team member.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - **Run Falmouth**

Run Falmouth is organised by Cornwall Hospice Care (registered charity number 1113140) and Falmouth Road Runners. It is licensed by UK Athletics, is held under UKA rules and is a 2019 guest member of the Cornwall Glass and Glazing Grand Prix series. UKA Race licence no: 2019 – 32194. Course Measurement No: 17/029



- To register; **each** person must register online and pay the appropriate fee: Registration for affiliated runners is £17 and for non-affiliated runners is £19. **There will be no entries on the day.**
- Runners in the Half Marathon race must be **18 years or over** on race day.
- All registration fees are **non-refundable**. The registration fee is per person.
- If you are unable to take part please let us know as soon as possible by calling us on 01726 66868 (option 3) – your place is non transferrable and may be reallocated by the Charity.
- By entering for **Run Falmouth** you agree to your name and any photographs which might be taken of you being used by Cornwall Hospice Care.
- For the safety of all participants, no pets or other animals are permitted on this half marathon.
- Competitors are advised that dogs, wheelchairs, wheeled carriages and cycles are banned, and that competitors cannot be accompanied or followed, either on foot or by vehicular conveyance of any description. (Please note, exceptions can be made at the race director's discretion for visually impaired competitors running with a guide).
- **No** alcohol is to be consumed prior to or during the event.
- MP3 Players, earphones or similar devices are **NOT** permitted on the route.
- Race numbers must be collected from registration on the day and prior to the race start.

By registering for **Run Falmouth you confirm that you are medically fit to run and understand that the organisers will not be held responsible for any injury, illness, damage or loss to you or caused by you, however caused.**

You enter into this event entirely at your own risk, waiving any legal recourse for damages to yourself, which may arise from participation in this event organised by Cornwall Hospice Care.
