At home and in your local community:

Planning an event

Event planning made simple

Everyone wants their next big idea to be a success. Give yourself plenty of time and with our advice you'll enjoy it more and be sure to welcome big crowds.

Where should my event take place?

First, start with how much space you'll need and plan from there. Indoors or out, big or small, all are key factors in deciding your favoured location. What facilities will you need? Toilets are often overlooked! If home isn't suitable, what about in your workplace, or somewhere in your community?

Consider other local and national events as conflicting with existing events could limit the numbers of people who may come.

Don't forget to tell your venue why you're doing your event, you might get a discount if you mention it's for Cornwall Hospice Care.

Stick to your budget and set a realistic target

Having a realistic target will help you keep motivated and focused, so you can raise more.

Think about how much you want to raise once you've taken out your costs and don't be afraid to share your goal. Everyone will want you to succeed so seeing your progress is important.

Remember to watch every penny, it's easy sometimes to get swept up and spend your profit... businesses can help too e.g., by donating prizes for a raffle.

JustGiving is Cornwall Hospice Care's preferred online sponsorship site, it's quick and easy to use and they send all the donations you receive to us automatically, so you don't need to worry. JustGiving also claim and pay us any Gift Aid your supporters commit to, it's a win win!

To create your JustGiving Page

Top tips:

- Tell your story. People are interested in you and why you're doing what you're doing.
- Don't be shy. Set your target high, people will donate to help you reach it.
- Personalise it. Photos and videos are a great way to share your progress. Don't forget to link your Strava account too, which will automatically share your training.
- Use our free email signature image on our website to link your JustGiving page to your work and personal emails.

Gift Aid

It might just be a little tick in a box, but Gift Aid can make a huge difference when it comes to how much money we can raise to fund our care and at no extra cost to you.

Any UK taxpayer can include Gift Aid when they donate, allowing Cornwall Hospice Care to claim an extra 25p for every £1 donated.

Be sure to follow the instructions on your sponsor form and you won't go wrong.

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Matched Giving

Did you know that many companies run a matched giving scheme, where they can match all or part of what you raise? Ask your employer if they do, and if they don't, now is a great time to start... it's tax-efficient to them!

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Fundraising Guidelines

How to pay in your fundraising

Staying safe and legal

We want you to achieve the best that you can. So, before you start, read our guidelines below:

For your safety

Public liability Insurance:

Cornwall Hospice Care is unable to accept liability or responsibility for anything that might happen to people or property as a result of your fundraising activity. If you're planning an event with the general public, you'll need public liability insurance.

Food Safety: If food is sold at an event, adequate facilities should be used for the preparation and sale of the food. Anyone handling food for sale will need appropriate certification to do so.

Risk Assessment: Assessing potential risks and hazards dramatically reduces the risk of injury or harm. We can help with example risk assessments.

Staying on the right side of the law

Collections:

In a public space you'll need a collection permit from your local authority. On private property you'll need the landowner or operator's permission.

Raffles and Lotteries: If your raffle or draw takes place on the day you can use cloakroom tickets. Otherwise, in nearly all circumstances a lottery license from your local authority is required.

Selling alcohol or hosting live music: You'll need a license for both from your local authority.

Advertising material: Use of the Cornwall Hospice Care logo is allowed, but must be the 'In Support of Cornwall Hospice Care' logo, available to you at www.cornwallhospicecare.co.uk /fundraisingmaterials.
